Fingal County Council – Register of Electors - You Must Be On The Register to Vote

The date for the General Election to elect the members of the 31st Dáil has now been confirmed as Friday the 25th of February 2011.

Voting in the General Election is open to all Irish citizens living in Ireland who are aged 18 or over on polling day and whose name appears in the register of electors. British citizens who are resident in Ireland are also entitled to vote provided they are 18 or over and their name is on the register of electors. You can check that your name appears on the register at www.checktheregister.ie

If your name is not on the register you can apply to be added to the supplemental register which will enable you to vote in this election. To do this you can download [Form RFA2](#) and complete it or if you have recently moved address from one constituency to another you should download and complete [Form RFA3](#) and return it to Fingal County Council before **5pm on Tuesday 8th of February 2011.**

The Full Draft Register is held at Fingal County Hall, Swords, and the Draft Register relating to the Dublin 15 area only is held at Blanchardstown Civic Offices, Grove Road, Dublin 15.

Each of the Fingal County Libraries also hold the Draft Register relating to their specific area, and as all libraries provide free internet access, you can access www.checktheregister.ie and download RFA2 and RFA3 forms from www.fingalcoco.ie. Branch library opening hours may vary, and are listed below.

It is the sole responsibility of each person over 18 years of age to ensure that they are on the Register of Electors, and that their details are correct.
