



FINGAL JOINT POLICING COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT 2016

Introduction

Fingal Joint Policing Committee was established in 2008 and is a partnership between Fingal County Council, An Garda Síochána and the Community. The membership consists of Senior Garda officers, elected Councillors and Oireachtas members, and representatives of community & voluntary groups drawn from the Public Participation Network (PPN)

The Fingal JPC is intended to be a forum for discussion and a means of building confidence, trust and safety in the county. In doing this, the Fingal JPC seeks to prioritise key community policing policy issues and identify initiatives which will contribute to improved community policing and prevention or reduction of future crime in Fingal County.

Role of the JPC

The legislative framework for the establishments of Joint Policing Committees is set out in Section 36 of An Garda Síochána Act 2005 and the amendments to this act in 2014. Section 36 (2) of the Act provides that a JPC's function is to serve as a forum for consultations, discussions and recommendations on matters affecting the policing of the local authority's administrative area, and in particular to:-

- Keep under review, a) the levels and patterns of crime, disorder and antisocial behaviour (including the patterns and levels of misuse of alcohol and drugs) and b) the underlying factors that contribute to these issues.
- Advise the local authority and the Garda Síochána on how they might best perform their functions and do everything feasibly possible to improve the safety and quality of life, to prevent crime, disorder and anti-social behaviour
- Arrange and host public meetings concerning matters affecting the policing of the local authorities administrative area
- Establish in consultation with the local Garda Superintendent and specific neighbourhoods, local policing fora to discuss and make recommendations to the JPC.
- Co-ordinate the activities of the local policing fora.






Garda Divisions Covered By Fingal Joint Policing Committee

The Fingal Administrative area falls under two Garda Divisions – Dublin Metropolitan Regions West and North as follows:

- DMR West Covering the general Dublin 15 area and parts of rural and urban Finglas
- **DMR North** Consisting of a number of Districts and Sub-Districts covering the remainder of the county.

- Friday 02nd December 2016


Fingal Joint Policing Committee Public Meetings in 2016

Changes in Membership in 2016

There were a number of changes of Membership to the Fingal JPC in 2016.

- Following the General Election on 26th February, Cllr Jack Chambers was elected to Dáil Éireann and resigned from Fingal County Council. He was replaced on Fingal County Council by Mr. Howard Mahony, and Cllr Mahony then replaced Cllr Chambers on the Joint Policing Committee.
- This created a vacancy for a Community Representative on the JPC, as Cllr Mahony had previously served as a PPN member. This vacancy was not filled in 2016.
- In September, Cllr J.P. Browne resigned from Fingal County Council and Mr. Tom O'Leary was co-opted to the Council as his replacement. Cllr O'Leary was then nominated to the Joint Policing Committee
- The Oireachtas Membership came into effect from June 2016, following the General Election on 26th February 2016, and nomination process.
- In mid-2016, Chief Superintendent Clavin moved from DMR-West and was replaced by Chief Superintendent Wheatley.

Fingal Joint Policing Committee Work Programme for 2016

The rolling Annual Work Programme for the Fingal JPC covers four sections, each with a number of strategic objectives.

1. Community Engagement and Awareness

- a. Engagement between stakeholders on matters concerning Community safety
- b. Public Meetings: Forum for discussion, consultation and recommendations
- c. Public awareness of Joint Policing Committee

2. Traffic and Road Safety

- a. Co-ordinated approach to traffic management for large events
- b. Road Safety measures: Education and awareness programmes in primary and post-primary schools
- c. Road Safety measures: Ongoing liaison in relation to high-frequency accident locations
- d. Compliance in Residential Estates





3. Crime Reduction, Prevention and Analysis

- a. To reduce the levels of anti-social behaviour
- b. Analysis and review of levels and patterns of crime and disorder and the factors underlying
- c. Crime prevention through environmental design

4. People and Demographics

- a. Opportunities for young people to have positive engagement with policing of their local communities
- b. Ensure older persons feel safe and participate fully in their community as a result of feelings of safety
- c. Integration of Ethnic Minority Groups through partnership initiatives
