This is an outdoor event; there may be strong sunlight or rain (or both). No children under 14 permitted. All equipment provided.

Water scorpions, frog tadpoles, newt tadpoles, water boatmen, pond skaters - names you may never have heard of, but they live deep below the water surface. GUIDED WALK OF TURVEY NATURE RESERVE with **DR. FRANK PRENDERGAST** (BirdWatch Fingal)

10:00am - 12:00pm at Turvey Nature Reserve

Would you like to explore the birdlife of Turvey Nature Reserve and Park in the expert company of Birdwatch Fingal? Come along to this guided walk with Dr. Frank Prendergast to see and hear birds in this unique habitat. Turvey Nature Reserve/Park is rightly called Dublin's greatest wilderness. Under constant management by Fingal County Council, the area features wild meadows, wetland restoration, forest walks and the Broadmeadow Estuary which is a mecca for a vast range of ducks, waders and geese in winter months. Bird species include several raptor species - peregrine falcon, sparrowhawk, merlin and buzzard. Barn owls also hunt there. The walk is perfectly timed to coincide with the arrival of our spring migrants such as swallow, sand martin and various species of warbler. Bird song identification will be a feature of the walk, adding to what will be a most enjoyable event.

Please note this event involves walking and standing outdoors, so bring comfortable/appropriate clothing and footwear. The route will be wheelchair accessible. This guided walk will leave from Turvey Nature Reserve Car Park at 10:00am sharp. All welcome, no booking necessary. GUIDED TRIP TO IRELAND'S EYE with HOWTH CLIFF CRUISES

11:00am at Howth Harbour



This tour explores the treasures of Ireland's Eye, Howth Harbour and Balscadden Bay. Take a trip around Ireland's Eye, taking in spectacular views of the island, the Martello Tower, and the colony of seals and birds which inhabit the area. The tour offers an exclusive opportunity to land on the island (weather permitting), which is a Nature Reserve and a sanctuary for wildlife in the Dublin Bay Biosphere. Commentary on the history, wildlife and the famous Kirwan murder on the island is provided.



Meet at the Howth Harbour West Pier (D13 H2V4). Please dress appropriately for the weather and wear sturdy, comfortable shoes suitable for walking, light climbing and slippery rocks on the island. Dogs are allowed on the cruise but must be kept on a lead and are legally prohibited on the island itself. 


18 MAY

WOODLAND WALK with FAITH WILSON

11:00am - 1:00pm at St. Catherine's Park

Join ecologist Faith Wilson on a guided walk around St. Catherine's Park. The park consists of about 200 acres of woodland and grassland. Plant enthusiasts may get a chance to see yellow archangel, wood anemone, hairy St. John's wort and toothwort. The woodlands support a diversity of trees, including ash, beech, horse chestnut, sycamore, hazel, holly and yew. You may also spot birds like treecreepers, siskins, blackcaps and jays among the trees.



WHALE WATCH IRELAND 2024 with IRISH WHALE AND DOLPHIN GROUP

5:00pm - 7:00pm at Howth Head

This annual event, now in its 22nd year, comprises free and guided whale watches at local headlands and vantage points, as part of All-Ireland whale watch day. These simultaneous land-based watches at 11 sites around the Irish coast provide IWDG researchers, whale enthusiasts and Citizen Scientists alike with a unique overview of whale and dolphin activity on the day and you can play an important part. While there are no guarantees of sightings, given reasonable weather you have a good chance of seeing some of the marine species that can be viewed locally.

This event is suitable for all ages and is aimed at everyone from the povice wildlife enthusiast to the experienced.

from the novice wildlife enthusiast to the experienced naturalist. We advise participants to dress appropriately for the weather conditions on the day. There may be a short, elevated walk from the meeting point to your watch site, so sensible footwear is recommended, and your local watch may not be wheelchair accessible. You should bring binoculars, your sense of humour and refreshments, but please leave your pets at home.



The group will meet at Balscadden car park. This event is free and no registration is required. In the event of unsuitable weather your watch leader may need to cancel your local event at short notice; so, if any doubt, please check in with them using the contact details below or on www.iwdg.ie/events.

MEET THE GOATS with MELISSA JEUKEN

11:00am - 1:00pm at Howth



Come meet the firefighting goats of Howth Head and their goatherd, Melissa Jeuken. The goats graze the wildfire breaks and reduce the cover of gorse and brambles, offering a more sustainable solution to managing the landscape which also benefits local biodiversity. The animal stars of the Howth Conservation Grazing project hail from Co. Mayo and belong to the heritage Old Irish Goat breed, recognised as an Irish Native Rare Breed in 2022. Serving a dual role in fire prevention and breed preservation as part of the Old Irish Goat Breeding Programme, the herd has produced the first Old Irish Goats to be born in Dublin in over 70 years.



Two sessions on Wednesday, 22nd May, 2024: 11:00am - 1:00pm and at 2:00pm - 4:00pm. Please only register for one session. The meeting point for the event will be at the entrance to the Red Rock Lands off Strand Road, Google Map Coordinates: 53.372927, -6.097518. If you're driving to the event the closest area to park is along Strand Road and Shielmartin Park Road. This is an outdoor event on uneven terrain, so it is not suitable for people with limited mobility. Please wear sensible, sturdy shoes (such as hiking boots) and dress appropriately for the weather (rain or shine) and coastal winds. Any children must be accompanied and supervised by an adult. Take a day trip to Howth and explore the south facing cliffs on a guided hike in spectacular areas of natural beauty. Hike across heathlands and blankets of wildflowers to the cliffs overlooking Dublin Bay, follow quiet coastal trails to secret beaches and hidden coves and discover the famous Martello Towers and Baily Lighthouse. Finally, ascend the cliff path to the Summit with its panoramic views before heading back down to the village. Be ready for 10km to 15km (6 to 9 miles) in about 4 hours. We recommend cross trainers, boots or stout shoes and light weight long trousers to avoid nettle stings. Light waterproof, gloves, scarf and hat in a backpack may also be useful, depending on the weather. Bring along water and a snack to enjoy en route.
